Chapter 8 Sharing the Knowledge – Inquiry Project and Power Point Presentation.

Define: (Your presentation must start with explanations of what these terms mean.)

- Indigenous Peoples/Endangered Cultures
- Assimilation
- Resource Development
- Minorities
- Traditional Knowledge
- Conservation and Development/Sustainable Resource Management
- Shamans
- Discrimination and Assimilation

Questions (Your presentation must answer these questions) Each slide must start with a title using key words from the question. One slide per question.

1. What is one thing that indigenous people have in common across the world?
2. Who are the Tuareg? What problems do they face?
3. Why did the Canadian government ban traditional ceremonies and educate Aboriginal children in English or French?
4. Who are the Chukchi and what challenges do the Chukchi face?
5. Why are indigenous peoples around the world feeling threatened by governments and business? What can they do about it (use the Haisla and the Yanomami as examples. Explain where they come from, what challenges they faced and how they overcame the challenges. Were they successful)?
6. What is the World Council of Indigenous Peoples (where was it formed, when and what is its' goal?)
7. Why is using too much chemical fertilizer not sustainable (internet)? How have 3 indigenous tribes come up with solutions from their cultures?
8. Why do some researchers believe that indigenous elders and shamans are our best hope for finding new treatments and cures for diseases?
9. After the English arrived in Australia, why were there fights between Aboriginal peoples and the settlers? What eventually happened to them? (p140).
10. Who are “uncontacted peoples”? Where do they exist? What dangers do they face? How could we help them? How could we harm them? (internet: <http://www.survivalinternational.org/articles/3109-questions-and-answers-uncontacted-tribes>)

Culminating Inquiry Question (take 3 or 4 slides to complete this question):

- 10) Imagine you are the Brazilian government and you have discovered the existence of another uncontacted tribe. They are starving, and many members of the tribe will die without food, and the first to die will be children. They have faced this before. Should

Directions and Criteria

1. You will need to create a power point presentation that includes both pictures and text.
2. You will present your PowerPoint project, discussing each slide, not just reading out what is written but adding details and information.

How?

You will:

1. Use the internet, your Global Citizens Text book and any other resources you can find to help you research the answers to the questions.
2. Copy and paste any information you find that is relevant into MS Word.
3. Key word that information using our key wording rules. No plagiarism.
4. Save this as Inquiry Project Research Your Name to your H:/Drive and/or USB Drive.
5. Check that you have answered all the questions and add more detail as needed.
6. Edit for meaning and grammar using word talk.
7. Proof read for COPS. Print it off, and have a partner proof read it, using the SOCs.
8. Copy and Paste into your slides in Power Point.
9. Make sure all your information is presented in a logical sequence and your presentation doesn't jump around.
10. You must create a bibliography using the APA format and an online bibliography creator like <http://www.bibme.org/>

Criteria for your Power Point Presentation (What it must look like, how it must work)

1. Use a minimum of 12 slides; a maximum of 18 slides.
2. Every slide must have title, a picture (1 or 2) and text must be at least 18 font.
3. A slide should have no more than 8 sentences or points.
4. Text must stand out from the background colour: it must be easy to read. Slides must not be black and white. No decorations or borders.
5. You must choose a standard font (nothing fancy and hard to read!)
6. Slides must have transitions, and transitions must be via a click; not automatic.
7. Within a slide, you may not have automatic text appearing. You must either have all the text present as soon as the slide shows up, or you may click to make text appear one point at a time.
