History of Jazz - The 1700's



- When Africans arrived in the New World in chains as servants and slaves in the 17th and 18th centuries, they were entering an alien world. The languages, religious beliefs, dress, food were different from what they were used to.
- But they carried their music and traditions with them. The powerful rhythms of **African percussion** influenced American music.
- Slave work songs were created in the African tradition of calland-response. To tell a story, a song leader would call out a line and the workers would respond to the call. Many slaveholders did not allow the slaves to speak to each other, so the only way they could communicate was through work songs.
- They developed many different ways of getting their secret messages across in the lyrics (Words).
