



4. What was the greatest change during the I-R? What does manufacturing mean?
5. What did manufacturing lead to?
6. What did machines do for the manufacturing process? What were most of the machines powered by?
7. Describe what the wages, working conditions and health/safety was like for the children who had to work in these factories.
8. Draw a Venn diagram like this in your duo-tang. Make sure it is large and fills the page: **NEATLY** fill in all the good aspects and bad aspects of the I-R. In the middle put aspects that could be both good and bad.



9. What happened in Winnipeg in 1919? What was done to improve the working conditions of workers during the Industrial Revolution?

5. Why are rural areas very important to urban areas?
6. What challenges are we going to face as cities get bigger over the next century?
